

Tenses

Verbs have tenses. A tense tells us when an action has taken place. There are basically three tenses: past, present and future. We use is, are, has and have with the present tense, and was, were, and had with the past tense.

TENSES

Present

A verb which refers to present time is said to be in the present tense. Example: I write. I study.

Past

A verb which refers to past time is said to be in the past tense. Example: I wrote. I studied.

Future

A verb which refers to future time is said to be in the future tense.

Example: I will write. I will study.

SIMPLE PRESENT

Read the following sentences.

- I am Emma.
- · Dean is a smart boy.
- They are good students
- · Nancy has a black pen.
- · Ben and John have blue pens.
- · I have a black pen.
- You have a red top.

The above sentences are in simple present tense. We use this tense to make general observations (activities that happen regularly).

See the table below.

See the tar	Singular	Plural
First parson	1 play	we play
First person Second person	you play	you play
Third person	he/she/it plays	they play

Note how the verb forms in present tense change with first, second and third person.

(a) When the subject is singular, the verb is singular. Usually 's' or 'es' is added to the verb in third person, singular number to its root form.

Example:

- · He dances to the tune.
- (b) When the subject is plural, the verb is also plural.

Example:

They dance to the tune.

However, there is an exception to the rule. Example:

- I dance.
- You dance.

- He is playing basketball. (is + play + ing)


The sentences above are in present continuous tense. The present continuous tense shows an action that is happening at the moment of speaking. The present continuous tense forms are made by putting is/am/are before the -ing for of the verb.

Here is how we express the present continuous tense with nouns and pronouns.

	am	root verb + ing	
we/you/they/all plural nouns	are	root verb +ing	
he/she/it/all singular nouns	is	root verb + ing
