

Sentences

A sentence is a group of words that makes complete sense.

Examples:

- I am a boy.
- You are a girl.

A sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a full stop (.) or a question mark (?) or an exclamation mark (!) depending upon what kind it is.

The words in a sentence should be placed in proper order, to make sense.

Example:

- · saw a snake I. (does not make sense)
- I saw a snake. (makes sense)
