(Q1) When you play Kabaddi, how many players are there in a team?

Ans:- There are seven players in a team.

(Q2) When Shyamala touched the middle line, how many players got out?

Ans:- Seven players got out.

(Q3) Do you have ways to resolve disputes in games?

Ans:- We try to remain calm and peaceful and obey the referee. We hear to all side and then come to a decision.

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(Q4) Try to hold your breath and keep saying Kabaddi - Kabaddi. How could you say it?

Ans:- I can say it about 20-25 times.

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(97) In some games it is very important to touch the player. For example in the game of kho-kho, you get turn by someone's touch. Name some games in which it is very important to touch the players.

Ans:- Some of the games are Kabaddi, Kho-kho, Chupa-chupi, arm wrestling, hide and seek etc.

(98) In Kabaddi, the entire team was out, because Shyamala had touched the line. What are some other games in which, the line is very important?

Ans:- Tag of war, badminton, table tennis etc.

(99) What are the games in which, besides the players, you have to touch some things or colours?

Ans: Touch a thing - Kho-kho.

Touch a colour - Colour-race.

(Q5) How many times can you say it, while you are playing Kabaddi?  
Is there any difference?

Ans:- I can say it about 15-20 times. While playing the number of times of repeating Kabaddi-Kabaddi is reduced.

(Q6) What does it mean to be out in games? When does one get out in Kabaddi?

Ans:- To go out in games means the player will not be allowed to continue the game. In Kabaddi a player gets out of three ways:

- (i) If he is stopped by the opposition
- (ii) He touches opposition player and could not stop him.
- (iii) If he loses breath and cannot say Kabaddi-Kabaddi.
